- Cathy Smith and I learned a lot at the Financial Literacy conference on October 22nd in Green Bay. We are excited to start using two free programs.

 - o Secure Futures Money Path
- The first Career Readiness Community of Practice meeting was fantastic. Last week we met as a team to reflect on what we are currently doing for career readiness, what is working, what needs improvement, and our vision for career readiness in grades K-12. We will start to map out our ideas at our next team meeting. Imagine career and college readiness throughout our curriculum. One idea we are mulling over is career/college corners in each classroom.
- Starting the week of November 13th, I will start coaching two teachers and we are looking forward to improving instructional practices.
