- We had 100% of 9th and 10th graders complete the PreACT. For the ACT we had only 1 parent opt out and then all other 11th graders completed the exam.
- MAP Spring testing begins on Monday, May 8th. The window will remain open until Friday, May 26th.
- I had another meeting with the Collaborative Classroom representatives and we have developed a great plan for the ELA pilot next year in grades 3-5. We will also pilot their intervention program SIPPS in grades K-5 and with Angela Botka. The one cost we will have is for training and support.
 - Grades 3-5 will pilot both the Being a Reader and Being a Writer curriculum. SIPPS will be used to support the students who are not reading at grade level.
 - K-2 will pilot the SIPPS intervention curriculum to get a better understanding of how the program works and if it will work with our students.
 - We will receive materials at no cost, but will sign an MOU. The representatives from Collaborative Classroom are working on the MOU and other details. I hope to have that information next week.
 - We will have a dedicated coach to work with our staff during the pilot. We will need to pay for the training and the coach, but it will be a vital part of making this pilot a success. The coach will come on-site to work with teachers, most likely in October.
 - The hope is to have brief training in June, it will be virtual. The goal of this training will be to introduce the staff to the curriculum.
- The SIR and TFI for all schools will be completed the week of May 15th. These surveys will look at our PBIS and RtI systems, to better understand where we need to make improvement and changes. They will be completed by teams of teachers and myself. I will share the results in June.
- I met with a representative from Sources of Strength to learn more information about their 6-12 program. No decisions have been made as to if we will use it. I feel strongly after meeting with Jaymie from Sources of Strength and receiving feedback from other tribal schools using it that our students and staff would benefit from the program. I am happy to share more details at the board meeting.
- I also met with Brittany from Engage Wisconsin this week and learned more about how this attendance and tutor support program works. I will provide the admin team with the information I learned at our next meeting and am happy to share details at the next board meeting. It is a program paid for by the state to support students who are absent a lot as well as students who are not passing classes.
- The majority of staff have completed my digital curriculum survey. Next week I will reach out to IXL, eSpark, Newsela, MobyMax, and a couple of other new ones I learned about to get quotes. I also need to talk to some staff one-on-one about which subscriptions they would like, for example, Newsela has English, Social Studies, and Science.
