Student Success:

Scores are back from all of our PreACT and the ACT. There were two freshmen, Class of 2027, with a composite score of 20 or higher. We had nine sophomores, Class of 2026, score 20 or higher. And the Class of 2025, juniors, had seven students with a composite score of 20 or higher. This year's senior class had two students who had a composite score of 20 or higher. ACT 20+ Club cords will be awarded to those seniors at our awards night.

Highest attendance honor goes to the seventh grade for the month of April, again. They were rewarded for two months with pizza, cake, and a movie. This month's reward will be an open gym during first and second periods.

Student & Staff Health and Wellbeing:

Instances of reported cyber-bullying are increasing, however so far every instance has been out of school. No phone policy contributes to much of the decrease of in-school cyber-bullying. We had no reports of cyber-bullying in April.

Internally, our district is continuing to use Gaggle. Gaggle gives alerts to counselor, principal, and district administrator when an online document flags specific student behavior/words. There was only one alert in the month of April. That reported item was a student using a school email account to report a vaping incident to a staff member.

Vaping detectors had been installed last summer. An anti-vaping team has been established. April ended with a total of fifty-one instances that the air quality in a restroom was compromised due to vaping suspicion. This is up 70% from March.

Community Collaborations and Partnerships:

Career Week was held in April for Middle School. Five guest speakers visited classrooms. The Life Flight and other first responders also were a part of the program. Special thanks to Eli Wilson for arranging the EMT's and flight.

Bayfield students, grade 7-12, were invited to participate in the Queer Prom. B.A.R.T. offered transportation to and from the event, funded by a Bayfield County grant.

Senior students had guest speakers from the Red Cliff AODA program and were invited to participate in the Safe & Sober graduation program. There is also a separate essay competition for three scholarships.

The middle school staff and students were able to attend a viewing of the movie "Bad River" in Ashland. Generous support from the Bayfield BEA helped fund the tickets and the transportation.

Efficient Use of Resources:

There are 214 MS/HS students enrolled in the program. Forty-seven staff members have accounts. The top five places for a pass request is 1. bathroom 2. Nurse Jackie 3. Katie Mak's room 4. Locker 5. Water fountain. The average pass time is 9.7

minutes. In April, there were 937 passes issued.

New Title IX regulations have been developed. Training for all administrators will be available August 1st.
