Student Success:

Highest attendance honor goes to the sixth grade for the month of May. Our Attendance ETaL Team awarded students with monetary rewards, in addition the Red Cliff Education Department contributed electronic prizes to use as incentives. Students received their prizes on the last day of school.

Student & Staff Health and Wellbeing:

Student survey results show the number one thing that high school students are dissatisfied by is the no phone policy. The policy was enacted two years ago to help prevent online bullying. I will work with our student council in the fall to review current policy and to gather more input.

Internally, our district is continuing to use Gaggle. Gaggle gives alerts to counselor, principal, and district administrator when an online document flags specific student behavior/words. There were two alerts in the month of May. One incident was a non-issue chat between two peers about gaming. The other incident was a chat between two peers about an incident that was already being investigated by administration.

Vaping detectors had been installed last summer. An anti-vaping team has been established. May ended with a total of fifty-four instances that the air quality in a restroom was compromised due to vaping suspicion. This is up 6% from April. However, the district has had two incidents of "vape detection" this week in restrooms that were vacant due to summer break. The reliability of the detectors will be reviewed this summer.

Community Collaborations and Partnerships:

Students are reminded that they may ride the BART, public transportation, free this summer. They were also reminded to check the return schedule so they don't end up stranded in Ashland or Washburn.

Efficient Use of Resources:

There are 214 MS/HS students enrolled in the program. In May, there were 901 passes issued. I've attached a full year in review document to my report.

New Title IX regulations have been developed. Training for all administrators will be available August 1st.
